Artemis Fund

Overview: The Artemis Fund is a donor-advised fund with the Community Foundation of Louisville administered entirely by high school students who are enrolled in a philanthropy course at Kentucky Country Day School. The Fund awards grants to local organizations working in Greater Louisville to support youth issues or promote youth development.

Application Period: Online application opens: 1/14/19. Due: 3/15/19. Grantees Announced: May.

Amount Awarded: Several grants totaling approximately \$6,000 each year.

Field of Interest Grants

Overview: Field of Interest Funds support organizations working within a specific geographic region; toward a specific purpose, such as supporting the arts or education; or with a specific population, such as children or the elderly. Each Fund was established by a donor with a specific charitable purpose in mind and, in perpetuity, CFL will continue to support the issues that the donor cared about most.

Application Period: Online application opens: 1/14/19. Due: 3/15/19. Grantees Announced: May.

Amount Awarded: Several grants totaling \$10,000-\$15,000 each year (varies each year).

Health Equity Fund

Overview: In 2016, Louisville received national recognition and designation as a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Culture of Health Prize winner. The Community Foundation of Louisville, The Humana Foundation, Jewish Heritage Fund for Excellence and Metro United Way pooled funds together to offer grants to Louisville nonprofits that meet annually defined criteria and have equity as a core value.

Application Period: Online application opens: 3/11/19. Due: 4/22/19. Grantees Announced: June.

Amount Awarded: Up to four grants, \$20,000 each for up to four organizations.

Fund for Louisville

Overview: Created by visionary philanthropists who wanted to support their community today and beyond their own lifetimes, the Fund for Louisville allows the Community Foundation to respond to emerging needs and opportunities in the Louisville area. The Fund currently offers capacity building grants to nonprofit organizations doing substantial work in parts of Louisville most impacted by longstanding disinvestment and underinvestment.

Application Period: Online letter of intent opens: June. Full applications requested: August. Grantees announced: December.

Amount Awarded: 20-25 grants totaling approximately \$430,000 each year.

Oldham County Community Foundation

Overview: The Oldham County Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Community Foundation of Louisville, provides grants to help Oldham County nonprofits improve their work.

Application Period: Online application opens: June 17. Due: August 2. Grantees Announced: 8/30.

Amount Awarded: 10-15 grants totaling approximately \$20,000 each year.

Overview: The Green River Area Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Community Foundation of Louisville, offers capacity building grants from its Owensboro-Daviess County Community Fund to nonprofits working in Daviess County.

Application Period: Online application opens: September. Due: November. Grantees Announced: Jan.

Amount Awarded: Several grants totaling approximately \$20,000 each year
