### Lasting Ways to Benefit Our Community

You can give to an existing fund or establish an endowment Fund that is customized to achieve just about any charitable purpose. Only a portion of the earnings from your endowment is used for grants, so your fund and your charitable legacy lasts forever.

#### Field of Interest Fund (\$25,000 minimum)

Earnings from this fund support a broad area you choose, such as health care, homelessness, the arts, environment, education, etc.

#### Unrestricted Gift for Shelby County (any amount)

A gift to the Shelby County Partnership Grants Fund is the most responsive option, with the earnings of the endowment used for grants to respond to changing community needs. Grants are determined by the SCCF Advisory Board.

#### Donor Advised Fund (\$25,000 minimum)

This should be considered if you and your family would like to advise on your fund by recommending specific grant distributions.

#### Scholarship Fund (\$50,000 minimum)

This can be established for a general scholarship, a specific school, or field of study.

#### Designated Fund (\$25,000 minimum)

Specifies one or more charitable organizations to receive a portion of the earnings from your fund.

# Who is the Shelby County Community Foundation?

*The Shelby County Community Foundation (SCCF) was organized in 1995 as an affiliate of the Community Foundation of Louisville. Our organization aims to provide the services of a community foundation to local residents and to begin building a collective charitable endowment for Shelby County.*

*The SCCF is part of a tax-exempt public charity that administers charitable funds created by Kentucky residents, businesses, and organizations for the betterment of their communities. Through programs like the **Endow Kentucky Tax Credit** and **Give for Good Louisville** consistently supporting the nonprofit organizations of Shelby County, charitable dollars make an even greater impact in our community.*

*Our mission also involves the encouragement of civic-minded Shelby County residents to add to our collective endowment by creating funds that support their charitable interests. **Charitable giving accounts** help simplify your philanthropy with a gift of any amount. **A permanently endowed fund** may be created with a gift of \$25,000 or more. Funds may be established by a lump sum, periodic gifts to build the fund, or a bequest through a will. Donors may also create funds that pay income to them for life and later provide for the future of a favorite charity and the community.*

*We are fortunate to be an affiliate of The Community Foundation of Louisville (CFL), which possesses the administrative, financial and legal expertise to manage its significant holdings of \$800+ million. Investing your funds with the total assets of CFL means **you can maximize your gift's impact** because it is included in a larger investment pool. Because the administrative costs are shared with other donors, you **free up more of your dollars for charitable giving** in Shelby County.*
